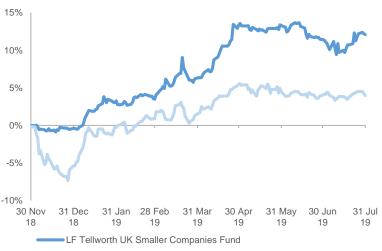


LF Tellworth UK Smaller Companies Fund

Fund Overview

- Objective: aim to provide long term (in excess of 5 years) capital growth, by investing in shares of small-sized UK companies.
- The Fund will invest at least 80% of its assets, directly or indirectly in shares of small-sized UK companies. These are companies that are domiciled, incorporated or have a significant portion of their business in the UK and, have a market capitalisation within the bottom 10% of the UK equities market.
- Fund managers Paul and John generate returns using a bottom up fundamental research approach.

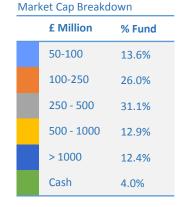

Summary

The return of M&A has probably been the stand out theme for the UK market in the last few weeks - decent businesses on cheap valuations denominated in sterling. A weaker global macro picture which is keeping rates down, a local currency depressed by political rhetoric and you have the recipe for some pretty healthy returns.

We should not underestimate what new political leadership might mean either. As many pundits focus on weaker sterling, the other PM and his cabinet possibly are by definition more pro-stimulus and pro-UK investment than any other Tory government in the last decade. They also currently have a big poll lead and a clear mission, two other scarcities in UK politics of late. At the base of all of this noise are companies and their management teams who enjoy little clarity on their outlook and a low propensity to take risk and invest – earnings forecasts remain under pressure for the majority.
