
Fund Aims

To maximise total return, while achieving a higher level of income than would be available from investment only in comparable UK Gilts, by investing primarily in a diversified portfolio of investment grade fixed interest securities denominated in sterling. Derivatives may be used with the intention of either protecting or enhancing the return on the Fund. More than 35% of scheme property may be invested in securities issued or guaranteed by Governments and / or other organisations worldwide. For further details please see the Prospectus.



Performance



Investment Proposition

The Fund seeks to maximise total return by investing primarily in a diversified portfolio of investment grade corporate bonds.

Performance is driven by stock selection. Ideas are sourced primarily from investment grade bonds and are driven by our fundamental, bottom-up stock analysis. The portfolio is well diversified with exposure typically to between 40–60 companies where individual holdings are sized according to our level of conviction in their prospects and the risks they pose.

We monitor our performance with reference to an index which comprises 100% sterling investment grade bonds.

Foreign currency bond holdings are typically hedged back to sterling. The Fund uses derivatives principally to reduce unwanted risks such as foreign currency exposure and active interest rate risk relative to our sterling based investment grade bond index. This can involve the use of currency forwards, bond futures and interest rate swaps.

The Fund is a sub-fund of the Baillie Gifford Bond Funds ICVC (Investment Company with Variable Capital) which is an umbrella Open-Ended Investment Company. Its Authorised Corporate Director ('ACD') is Baillie Gifford & Co Limited.

The share price is calculated daily at 10.00am and is based on the mid value of the underlying assets of the Fund, known as the net asset value. All shares are single priced.

The Distribution Yield reflects the annualised income net of expenses of the Fund (calculated in accordance with relevant accounting standards) as a percentage of the mid-market share price of the Fund (excluding tax) as at the date shown. As management expenses are charged from revenue for the Fund and income is distributed on an effective yield basis, the Underlying Yield is the same as the Distribution Yield.

The ongoing charges figure is based on actual expenses for the latest financial period. Where the Fund has been launched during the financial period and / or expenses during the period are not representative, an estimate of expenses may have been used instead. It may vary from year to year. It excludes the costs of buying and selling assets for the Fund.
