

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### COMMENTARY

The Fund rose 0.5% during the month compared to the FTSE All-Share Total Return, which fell by 1.4%. Year to date the Fund has risen 11.1% versus 12.8% for the FTSE All-Share Total Return.

Domestically, events were dominated once again by politics, and given the rise of circa 4% in the exchange rate versus the US dollar you could be forgiven for thinking that progress was being made. A combination of "no deal" being ruled out and an agreed deal with the EU were both welcome developments. Parliament's desire however for a longer period of time to scrutinize the agreed deal encouraged Boris Johnson to push for an election. Political forecasting of late has been a thankless task so we will not attempt to do so here. However, with Fund performance in mind, the last two months which have been characterised by both rising sterling and bond yields, have been better for the strategy. Our feeling is that a continuation of these trends would most likely occur under a Conservative majority given the certainty provided by the deal and the likely expansionary budget that would be enacted.

Moving internationally, it is fair to describe recent economic news as mixed. Manufacturing data in America, for example, was very weak and while job creation continues it has been slightly below expectations. The critical question for the world economy in the coming months is how much demand has been deferred by the emotive subjects of trade and Brexit and how it will respond to any resolution. A sign of the potential for pent up demand was seen with mortgage originations in America rising to a 14 year high in the third quarter.

Within the Fund, good performance was registered for the second month in a row by our airline holdings. IAG, for example, rose by 12% and Easyjet by 8%. Both companies released trading statements during the month. In the case of Easyjet, the company modestly revised up profit expectations for the year, while IAG confirmed trading was in line with expectations. The latter performance was better than it appeared given the recent industrial activity. With the shares starting the month on 4.6x earnings with a yield of circa 5% there is plenty of room for the valuation to improve. Elsewhere, there was also good performance from the online gambling company 888, which rose by 17%. The valuation of circa 12x earnings with a net cash balance sheet is attractive in absolute terms and our feeling is their recent growth initiatives in customer acquisition is starting to bear fruit. Added to this the company is due to be readmitted to the FTSE 250 index and the index buying that goes hand in hand with this is something we will look to take advantage of in due course.

On the downside, Bellway fell by circa 6% during the month. The shares have risen strongly this year from the support of book value and as such are now susceptible to anything other than good news. Results during the month highlighted some margin attrition and accordingly, for the second month in a row, we felt it appropriate to reduce our position. Lancashire, the non-life insurer, also fell by circa 5%. The company reports in US dollars and sterling strength is therefore detrimental in the short term. However, we believe there is more to the investment case than purely the exchange rate, and continue to see an improving pricing environment owing to outsized losses for the industry as a whole in 2018.

With trading activity in mind we were active, but this should be expected in the event there are outsized moves. Lloyds Banking Group, for example, rallied as much as 20% from the intra month lows and to a level appreciably above book value. With alternatives in their sector trading at a meaningful discount to book, such as Barclays, we felt a switch was appropriate. This premium to book mind set also encouraged us to reduce HSBC. Finally we think it is appropriate to mention Page Group. Whilst modestly higher on the month the shares corrected by as much as 20% in the wake of a revision to full year forecasts before recovering. This correction took the shares to a valuation akin to the financial crisis and given the net cash balance sheet we felt it appropriate to buy into the weakness.

We continue to thank investors for their support.

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






Market Risk - The Fund is subject to normal market fluctuations and the risks associated with investing in international securities markets. Therefore, the value of

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Counterparty Risk - The Fund will be exposed to credit risk on counterparties with which it trades in relation to on-exchange traded instruments such as futures and options and where applicable, 'over-the-counter' ("OTC", "non-exchange") transactions. Currency Risk - The value of investments designated in another currency may rise and fall due to exchange rate fluctuations. 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## **GLOSSARY**

Beta

Active Share Active share is a measure of the percentage of stock holdings in a manager's portfolio that differ from the reference index.

An annualised total return is an average amount of money earned by an investment each year over a given time period. It is calculated to show what an investor would earn over a period of time if the annual return was compounded. Annualised Return

Volatility is the rate and extent at which the price of a portfolio, security or index, moves up and down. If the price swings up and down with large movements, it has high volatility. If the price moves more slowly and to a lesser extent, it has lower volatility. It is used as a measure of the riskiness of an investment. Annualised volatility is an average annual amount of volatility over a given time period. Annualised Volatility

A measure of how sensitive an investment portfolio is to market movements. The sign of the beta (+/-) indicates whether, on average, the portfolio's returns move in line with (+), or in the opposite direction (-), to the market. The market has a beta of 1. If the portfolio has a beta of less (more) than 1, it means that the security is theoretically less (more) volatile than the market.

Comparator Benchmark An index or similar factor against which a fund manager invites investors to compare a fund's performance.

Constraining Benchmark An index or similar factor that fund managers use to limit or constrain how they construct a fund's portfolio.

A measure of the interdependence or strength of the relationship between two investments. A correlation of 1 means that the two investments are perfectly synchronised, -1 implies that they move in symmetrically opposite directions and 0 means no relationship between them. Correlation

Distribution Yield

The distribution yield reflects the amounts that may be expected to be distributed over the next twelve months as a percentage of the fund's net asset value per share as at the date shown, and may be estimated. It does not include any initial charge and investors may be subject to

tax on distributions.

**Entry Charge** The entry charge shown is a maximum figure and in some cases you might pay less. Please refer to your financial advisor or the distributor for

the actual charges

Exposure This refers to the part of a portfolio that is subject to the price movements of a specific security, sector, market or economic variable. It is typically expressed as a percentage of the total portfolio, e.g. the portfolio has 10% exposure to the mining sector.

Information Ratio A ratio of portfolio returns above the excess returns of a benchmark (usually an index) to the volatility of those returns. The ratio measures a

portfolio manager's ability to generate excess returns relative to a benchmark. Volatility is measured using tracking error.

The market value of a company's outstanding shares. The micro dollar market capitalisation is from 0 to \$500m, the small dollar market capitalisation is from \$500m to \$2.5bn, the mid dollar market capitalisation is from \$2.5bn to \$5bn, the large dollar market capitalisation is from **Market Cap** 

\$5bn to \$12.5bn and the mega dollar market capitalisation is \$12.5bn and above.

The Net Asset Value (NAV) represents the value per share. It is calculated by dividing the total net asset value of the fund (the value of the fund's assets less its liabilities) by the number of shares outstanding. NAV

Ongoing Charge Figure (OCF) The OCF is based on expenses and may vary from year to year. It includes management fees but excludes performance fees (where applicable) and portfolio transaction costs, except in the case of an entry/exit charge paid by the Fund when buying or selling units in another sub-fund.

The charges you pay are used to pay the costs of running the Fund, including the costs of marketing and distributing it. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.

Overweight/Underweight Refers to a fund's position in line with its chosen reference index. Overweight means a fund holds more of a certain security than the reference index and underweight means a fund holds less of a certain security compared to its reference index.

The payment made to an Investment Manager if certain performance levels are achieved (often over and above any levels set out in the investment objective) within a set time period. Please refer to the fund's prospectus for a complete description. Performance Fee

Position Concentration The proportion of a portfolio's net asset value represented by the largest (e.g. 5/10/20) positions.

Quartile rankings are a measure of how well a fund has performed against a group of similarly categorised funds. The rankings range from 1 to 4, with 1 representing the fund's performance being in the top 25% of funds in its sector. Quartile Ranking

Redemption Fee This is the maximum amount by which your investment may be reduced prior to the proceeds being paid out.

A sector is an area of the economy in which businesses share the same or a related product or service. It can also be thought of as an industry Sector (i)

or market that shares common operating characteristics. Dividing an economy into different pieces allows for more in-depth analysis of the economy as a whole.

Sector (ii) A peer group of funds which have a similar investment objective or invest in the same type of assets. These are organised by independent

companies such as the Investment Association in the UK. The average performance of a sector is often used to compare with the performance

The Sharpe Ratio is a measure for calculating risk-adjusted return, and has become the industry standard for such calculations. The Sharpe Ratio is the average return earned in excess of the risk-free rate per unit of volatility or total risk. The higher the ratio the better, with a number greater than 1 usually considered good, a number greater than 2 considered very good and a ratio of 3 or higher considered excellent. As it is an absolute measure of risk-adjusted return, negative Sharpe Ratios can be misleading and are therefore shown as N/A. Sharpe Ratio

Synthetic Risk & Reward

Indicator (SRRI)

Featured on the Key Investor Information Document (KIID), the SRRI is a measure of the overall risk and reward profile of a fund. Funds are categorised on a scale from 1 to 7 where 1 is the lowest risk and 7 is the highest. Typically, the SRRI is derived from the volatility of past returns over a 5-year period. Investors should be aware the indicator is based on historical data and may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the Fund. The lowest category does not mean risk free.
