

Management Commentary

The trust's share price and net asset value outperformed the benchmark in May. Our largest positive contributions came from Berkeley Group, Howden Joinery and Bellway, all of which are exposed to the UK housing market. Following its recent initial public offering, Shawbrook Bank, a UK challenger bank, also performed well in the month and was a key positive contributor. The largest detractor from performance came from our position in Plus500. The stock suffered from increasing regulatory requirements impacting customer activity, before receiving an opportunistic bid approach at the end of the month. Not owning Booker also detracted from performance as the company announced an accretive acquisition that the market reacted positively to.

The company has the ability to use borrowing to gear the portfolio within the range of 5% net cash to 25% geared in normal market conditions.


