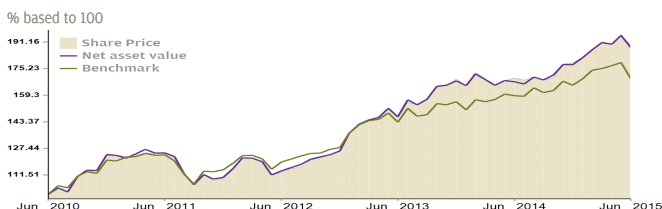
Monthly Update as at 30 June 2015

Management Commentary

The trust's share price and net asset value outperformed the benchmark in June. The investment trust sector outperformed in June, with the FTSE Equity Investment Instruments Index returning -3.1% vs. -5.7% for the FTSE All Share. Our holdings in JPM Indian Investment Trust, Fidelity Special Values and Artemis Alpha were the largest positive contributors to the portfolio's return. JPM UK Dynamic and JPM Claverhouse were the largest detractors due to their percentage weighting in the portfolio.

We continue to expect equities to outperform bonds this year, thereby supporting the performance of the trust. The US economy is in a mid-cycle phase and we are seeing growth after a weak beginning to the year. The euro area and Japan are poised to add to recent stronger fundamental data, while the UK rebounds from an anaemic first quarter.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

BENCHMARK COMPARISON - Comparison of the Company's performance is made with the benchmark. The benchmark is a recognised index of stocks which should not be taken as wholly representative of the Company's investment universe. The Company's investment strategy does not follow or track this index and therefore there may be a degree of divergence between its performance and that of the Company.

CASH - Net current assets including investment in liquidity funds & treasury stocks (if held) and drawn revolving credit facilities (if any) with an original maturity of less than 1 year.

DISCOUNT / PREMIUM - If the share price of an investment company is lower than the net asset value (NAV) per share, the company is said to be trading at a discount. If the share price of an investment company is higher than the net asset value (NAV) per share, the company is said to be trading at a premium. The discount/premium is shown as a percentage of the NAV.

GEARING - Gearing represents the excess amount above shareholders' funds of total assets expressed as a percentage of the shareholders' funds. Total assets include total investments and net current assets/liabilities less cash/cash equivalents and excluding bank loans of less than one year. If the amount calculated is negative this is known as a 'net cash' position.

SECTOR / GEOGRAPHICAL BREAKDOWNS - These are expressed as a percentage of total portfolio and cash. Investments in liquidity funds will be shown as cash.

TOP 10 HOLDINGS - These are expressed as a percentage of total portfolio and cash. Investments in liquidity funds / treasury stocks will not be shown in the top 10 holdings.
