The HSBC MSCI SOUTH AFRICA CAPPED UCITS ETF is an open ended UCITS V compliant exchange-traded fund incorporated in Ireland.

Fund objective

The investment objective of the Fund is to replicate the performance of the MSCI South Africa Capped Index (the "Index"), while minimising as far as possible the tracking error between the Fund's performance and that of the Index. The Index is a market-capitalisation weighted index designed to measure the performance of the largest companies in South Africa, as defined by the Index Provider.


