

Aberdeen Multi-Manager Balanced Managed Portfolio

Interim short report for the six month period to 30 April 2014

Investment objective and policy

To achieve a balance between capital growth and reasonable income. Investment will be primarily in shares or units of collective investment schemes. Up to 85% of the Portfolio will be invested in collective investment schemes which invest mainly in equities or which pursue a strategy mainly linked to equity investment. The Portfolio may also invest in other collective investment schemes including those which invest in fixed income holdings. The Portfolio may also invest directly in transferable securities, money market instruments, near cash, cash and deposits.

Manager's review

Global equities rose during the period under review. The outgoing chairman of the US Federal Reserve (Fed), Bernanke announced the beginning of tapering against improving economic data. European equities continued to recover, especially domestically-focused businesses as sentiment improved, driven by positive economic growth and lower borrowing costs in the periphery. However, in 2014 market volatility returned, driven in January by slower Chinese growth data, and towards the end of the period, the Russian annexation of Crimea.

Portfolio review

Over the six-month period under review, portfolio returns were driven by developed market equities with European and UK fund selections performing particularly well. The funds that look for under-valued companies (value-oriented) focused on the domestic market in Europe and those that invest in stocks that benefit the most from an upturn in the business cycle in the UK were the primary drivers of returns, such as JO Hambro UK Growth and Henderson European Focus. Countering the solid performance in the UK and Europe, emerging markets and Japan posted negative returns. Coupland Cardiff Asia Alpha had a particularly difficult period as it targets companies with high growth expectations (growth strategies) while investors focused on cyclical-value sectors and regions. Returns generated from the American positions were hampered by the weakening US dollar for sterling-based investors. Growth strategies also underperformed relative to value-oriented managers with Threadneedle American Extended Alpha lagging the peer group. In absolute terms the returns from the Japanese holdings in Pictet Japanese Equity Opportunities and GLG Japan Core Alpha were both negative, although on a relative basis both funds delivered top-quartile performance. Within the fixed-income holdings GLG Strategic Bond performed very well, and the absolute-return-oriented position in Threadneedle Global Opportunities Bond also delivered robust returns. Similar to equity markets, emerging-market bonds had a volatile period which drove negative returns from Liontrust Global Strategic Bond. The remaining fixed-income holding in Old Mutual Global Strategic Bond also delivered negative returns due to US dollar exposure and duration positioning. Over the period we increased the US value exposure by initiating a position in Legg Mason US Equity, and reduced existing holdings. Another addition was Threadneedle UK Extended Alpha, using profits from selling cyclically-oriented positions which had performed strongly.

Outlook

Interestingly, global markets trended higher despite emerging market growth concerns and Ukrainian geopolitical tensions. Focus has now shifted from the headwind of US Fed tapering, to when base rates will rise. However, rate hikes are dependent upon improved economic conditions. For the markets to keep rising, we need to see evidence of stronger growth translating into better profits for businesses. In our recent meetings with underlying fund managers, we were not surprised by lower market expectations, although they were confident that corporate earnings would rise. Hence, although we believe the gradual shift away from loose monetary policy will cause periodic spikes in volatility, we see this as a transition phase in the context of more robust long-run returns.

The Committee of European Securities Regulators (now named the European Securities and Markets Authority), introduced new methodology in 2012 for the calculation of ongoing charges figures which replaced total expense ratios. It is the ratio of the total ongoing charges to the average net asset value over twelve months and includes the annual management charge, the other operating expenses and a synthetic element of 0.74% (2013, 0.78%) to incorporate the ongoing charges of underlying fund investments.
