Fund objectives and investment policy

The fund aims to provide income and capital growth in excess of the MSCI AC Pacific ex Japan (Net Total Return) index (after fees have been deducted) over a 3 to 5 year period by investing in equities of Asia Pacific companies excluding Japan but including Australia and New Zealand. The fund is actively managed and invests at least 80% of its assets in equities of Asia Pacific companies, excluding Japan but including Australia and New Zealand, which offer dividend payments. The fund may also invest directly or indirectly in other securities (including in other asset classes), countries, regions, industries or currencies, collective investment schemes (including Schroder funds), warrants and money market instruments, and hold cash. The fund may use derivatives with the aim of reducing risk or managing the fund more efficiently.





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
