Aims

Objective: The investment strategy of the fund is to purchase units in the L&G Property Fund.

Underlying Fund Objective: The fund aims to carry on Property Investment Business and to manage cash raised from investors for investment in the Property Investment Business. In doing so, the objective of the fund is to achieve income and capital growth through investing generally in commercial property. The Fund will invest at least 60% of its assets in property and property-related assets. Although the Fund's investment in property and property-related assets is typically expected to be in the region of 80% - 90% of the Fund's assets, this may vary as a result of factors such as market conditions. The Fund may obtain its exposure through a combination of direct and indirect holdings with exposure across industry sectors (including but not limited to retail, offices, industrial, leisure, healthcare and residential) and geographies. The Fund's direct holdings, which will typically consist of around 45% of the Fund's assets, will be in property located in the UK. The Fund intends to purchase, hold and, where relevant, develop such properties with the intention of enhancing their capital value and/or income return. The Fund may also invest in money-market instruments (such as treasury bills), permitted deposits, bonds (issued by governments and public bodies), money market funds and cash. The Fund may only use derivatives for the purposes of Efficient Portfolio Management.


