Objectives and Investment Policy

Objective: The Fund seeks to achieve capital growth over the long term by investing in shares of companies with links to emerging markets excluding China.

Policy: in seeking to achieve its investment objective, the fund aims to deliver a return, net of fees, greater than that of the MSCI EM (Emerging Markets) ex China Index with net dividends re-invested over rolling 3 year periods.

The Fund will typically invest at least 80% in company shares and similar investments. Companies may be of all sizes and in any industry (e.g. pharmaceuticals, finance, etc).

The Fund will typically hold a relatively concentrated portfolio. It is not proposed to concentrate investments in any one industry or sector.

The Fund may use derivatives (i.e. financial contracts whose value is linked to the expected price movements of an underlying investment), with the aim of generating returns and reducing the overall costs and/or risks of the Fund.

The Fund is actively managed. Portfolio construction is driven by research into a company's future prospects in the context of the economic environment to identify attractively priced investment opportunities.

The Fund promotes environmental and social characteristics on an ongoing basis within the scope of Article 8 of the Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation. The environmental and social characteristics selected for the Jupiter Global Emerging Markets Focus ex China Fund include the promotion of the transition to a low carbon economy and upholding responsibilities to people and planet.

The Index is a broad representation of the Fund's investment universe. Although a large proportion of the Fund's investments may be components of the Index, the Fund has the ability to deviate significantly from the Index.

Portfolio transaction costs are paid out of the assets of the Fund in addition to the

charges set out below, and may have an impact on the performance of the Fund.

Recommendation: the Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within 5 years.

Treatment of income: as shares in this class are accumulation shares, income from investments will be reinvested into the Fund and reflected in the value of the shares.

Dealing: you can buy and sell shares on business days (excluding Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays) where retail banks are open for business in Dublin and London and the New York Stock Exchange is open for business in New York.

Risk and Reward Profile

The calculated risk and reward category, as shown above, uses a method of calculation derived from EU rules. It is based on the rate at which the returns of the Fund have moved up and down in the past (i.e. volatility) and is not a guide to the future risk and reward category of the Fund. The category shown is not a target or guarantee and may shift over time. Even the lowest category 1 does not mean a risk-free investment. The seven-category scale is nonlinear, for example, 2 is not twice as risky as 1.

Typically higher rewards

- Funds in category 6 have in the past shown relatively high volatility. With a fund of category 6, you have a relatively high risk of losing money but your chance for gains is also relatively high.

- Concentration risk (number of investments) the Fund may at times hold a smaller number of investments, and therefore a fall in the value of a single investment may have a greater impact on the Fund's value than if it held a larger number of investments.


