

abrdn MyFolio Multi-Manager IV Fund

Objective

To generate growth over the long term (5 years or more) while being managed to a defined level of risk. The fund is part of the MyFolio Multi-Manager range, which offers five funds with different expected combinations of investment risk and return. This fund is risk level IV, which aims to be the second highest risk fund in this range.

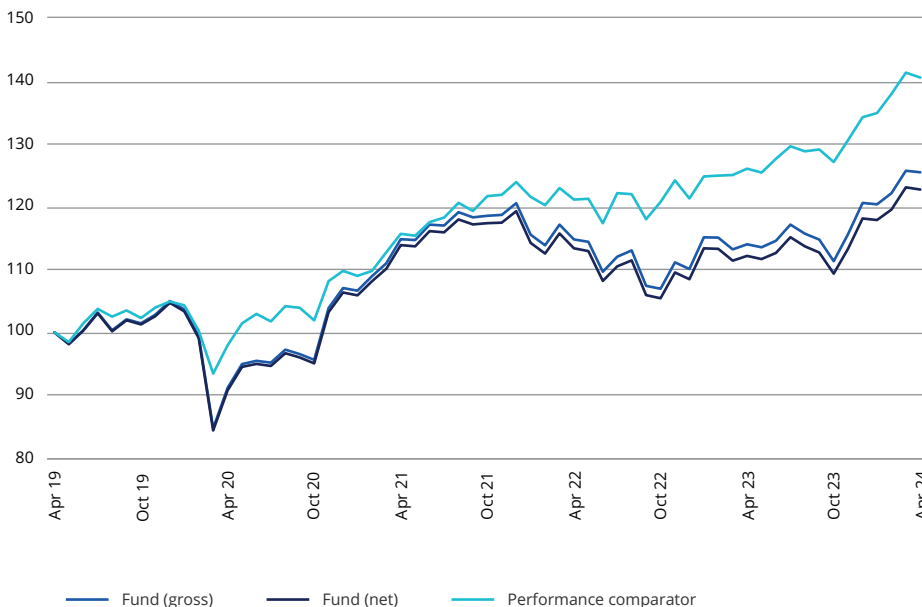
Risk Target: The defined level of risk referred to above that the management team is targeting is within the range of 60-90% of world stock markets (represented by the MSCI World Index), over 10 years. There is no certainty or promise that this target will be achieved. The Risk Target has been chosen as it represents a risk range which is appropriate for the fund.

Performance Comparator: For comparison purposes, investors can compare the fund's long term performance to a basket of assets (before charges) with a risk profile at the lower range of the Risk Target stated above (i.e. 60% of world stock markets), which is considered appropriate given the investment policy and Risk Target of the fund. This basket is composed 20% FTSE All-Share Index, 40% MSCI World ex UK Index and 40% SONIA Index.

Portfolio securities

- The fund will invest at least 60% in actively managed funds (which invest using manager discretion) and up to 40% in passively managed funds (which aim to replicate performance of a market index), including those managed by abrdn, to obtain broad exposure to a range of diversified investments.
- Typically, at least 60% of the fund will be invested in assets traditionally viewed as being higher risk such as equities (company shares), commercial property, alternative funds and emerging market bonds (which are like loans to companies or governments that pay a rate of interest, invested in regions including Eastern Europe, Asia, Africa, Latin America and the Middle East).
- The rest of the fund is invested in a selection of other assets. These will include assets such as equities (company shares) cash, assets that can be turned into cash quickly, government bonds (which are like loans to governments that pay interest) and investment grade corporate bonds (which are like loans to companies that pay interest and are typically regarded as having low default risk) and funds that use a combination of equities, bonds (which are like loans to companies or governments that pay interest) and derivatives.

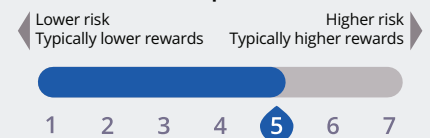

Key risks

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Management process

- In addition, they will take tactical asset allocations (changing short term proportions in each asset class) with the aim of improving returns.

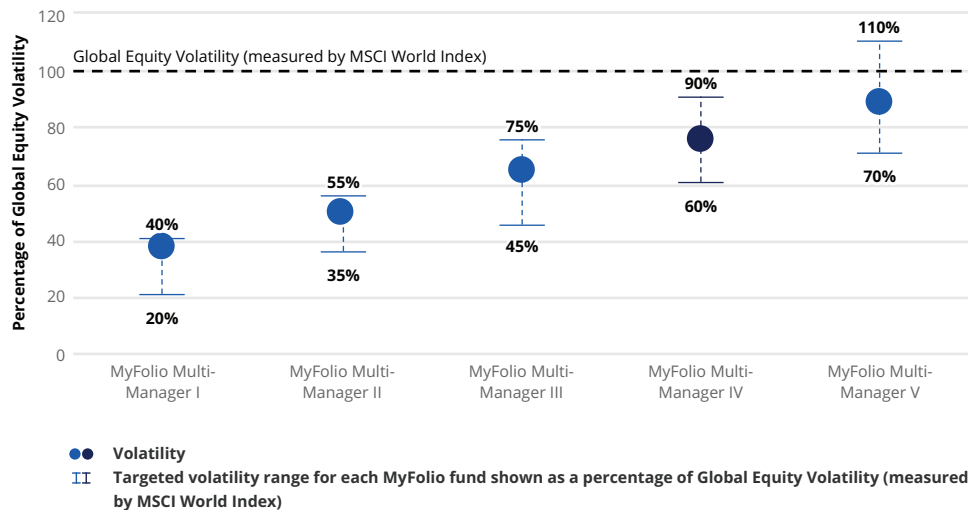

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Derivative usage

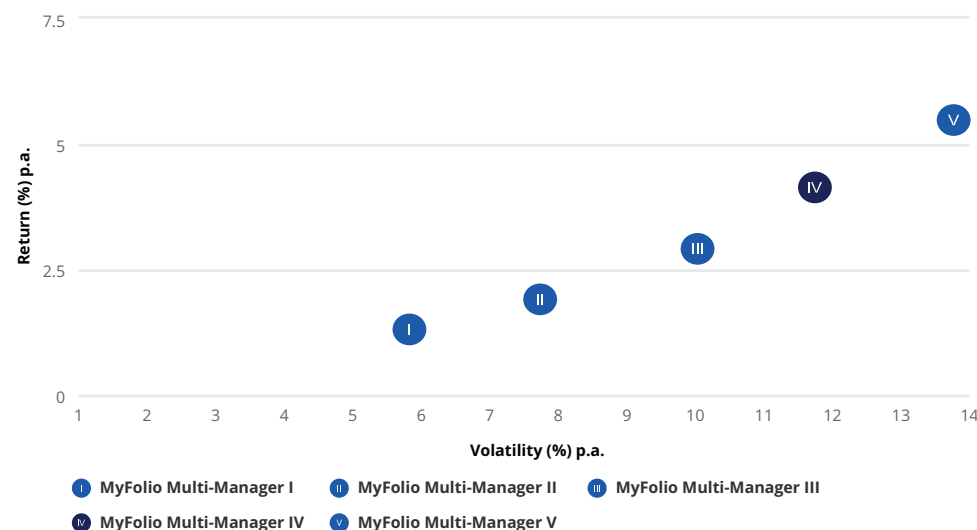
- The fund is not expected to invest in derivatives directly however it may invest in other funds which use derivatives.
