Objectives and Investment Policy

Objective The fund aims to maximise the total return on your investment through the tactical management of its exposure to a wide range of assets from around the world, using prudent investment management principles.

Investment Policy The fund aims to achieve this objective by taking exposure to a wide range of assets from around the world.

The fund will utilize a global multi-sector strategy that seeks to combine the investment advisor's total return investment process and philosophy with income maximization. As part of the global multi-sector strategy, the investment advisor may tactically allocate the fund's assets. The fund has a flexible approach to asset allocation which is driven by the investment advisor's consideration of various quantitative and qualitative data relating to global economies and expectations for growth of various industrial sectors and asset classes.

The fund will invest in company shares, fixed income securities (which are similar to loans that pay a fixed or variable rate of interest) issued by companies or governments, collective investment funds (which may be managed by PIMCO or unaffiliated managers) and cash.

Investment in fixed income securities may include up to 20% of the fund's net assets invested in structured notes.

The fund will typically invest 20% to 80% of its net assets in company shares or similar securities. As such, the fund's allocation to fixed income instruments will typically be determined in a manner that is reflective of, and consistent with, this 20% to 80% equity allocation range. Where considered by the investment advisor to be complementary to or consistent with the investment objective and policy of the fund, the fund may invest up to 10% of its net assets in units or shares of other collective investment schemes.

The fund may invest substantially in emerging markets, which in investment terms are those economies that are still developing.

The fund may invest up to 25% of its total assets in commodity related instruments, including derivatives based on commodity indices, commodity index-linked notes and exchange traded funds.

The fund may gain exposure to property through property related instruments including listed company shares, real estate investment trusts (REITs) or derivatives based on property related indices.

The fund is considered to be actively managed in reference to a blend of the following two indices: the MSCI All Country World Index (ACWI) and

the Bloomberg U.S Aggregate Bond Index weighted 60%/40% respectively (together the "Benchmark") by virtue of the fact that the Benchmark is used for calculating the global exposure of the fund using the relative VaR methodology and for performance comparison purposes. Certain of the fund's securities may be components of and may have similar weightings to the Benchmark. However, the Benchmark is not used to define the portfolio composition of the fund or as a performance target and the fund may be wholly invested in securities which are not constituents of the Benchmark.

Part or all of the exposure to equity and equity-related securities may be selected using the PIMCO Core Equity Strategy, which is a proprietary global equity strategy that seeks to deliver maximum total return. It has two components; a systematic component and the investment advisor discretionary component. The systematic component computes a series of quality, value, growth, and momentum scores for stocks within the MSCI ACWI universe to construct a proprietary composite signal, which helps facilitate a balanced approach to stock selection.

The fund may invest in derivative instruments (such as futures, options and swaps) for hedging and/or as part of its investment strategy. The derivatives return is linked to movements in the underlying assets.

The assets held by the fund may be denominated in a wide variety of currencies. The investment advisor may use foreign exchange and related derivative instruments to hedge or implement currency positions.

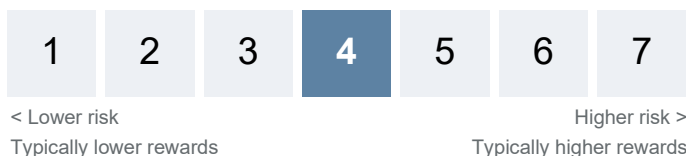

Distribution Policy This share class pays out a distribution of any investment income generated by the fund. You may elect for this to be reinvested into the fund.

Share Class Currency Hedging This share class seeks to limit the shareholder's currency risk by reducing the effect of exchange rate fluctuations between the share class currency and any non-active currency exposures of the fund.

Dealing Day You can buy and sell shares on most working days in Dublin, exceptions to this are more fully described in the fund holiday calendar available from the Administrator.

Risk and Reward Profile

In addition to the risk captured by the indicator, the overall fund value may be considerably affected by:

Credit and Default Risk A decline in the financial health of an issuer of a fixed income security can lead to an inability or unwillingness to repay

a loan or meet a contractual obligation. This could cause the value of its bonds to fall or become worthless. Funds with high exposures to non-investment grade securities have a higher exposure to this risk.

Currency Risk Changes in exchange rates may cause the value of investments to decrease or increase.

Derivatives and Counterparty Risk The use of certain derivatives could result in the fund having a greater or more volatile exposure to the underlying assets and an increased exposure to counterparty risk. This may expose the fund to larger gains or losses associated with market movements or in relation to a trade counterparty being unable to meet its obligations.

Emerging Markets Risk Emerging markets, and especially frontier markets, generally carry greater political, legal, counterparty and operational risk. Investments in these markets may expose the fund to larger gains or losses.

Equity Risk The value of equity or equity related securities may be affected by stock market movements. Drivers of price fluctuations include general economic and political factors as well as industry or company specific factors.

Liquidity Risk Difficult market conditions could result in certain securities becoming hard to sell at a desired time and price.

Interest Rate Risk Changes in interest rates will usually result in the values of bond and other debt instruments moving in the opposite direction (e.g. a rise in interest rates likely leads to fall in bond prices).

Mortgage Related and Other Asset Backed Securities Risks Mortgage or asset backed securities are subject to similar risks as other fixed income securities, and may also be subject to prepayment risk and higher levels of credit and liquidity risk.

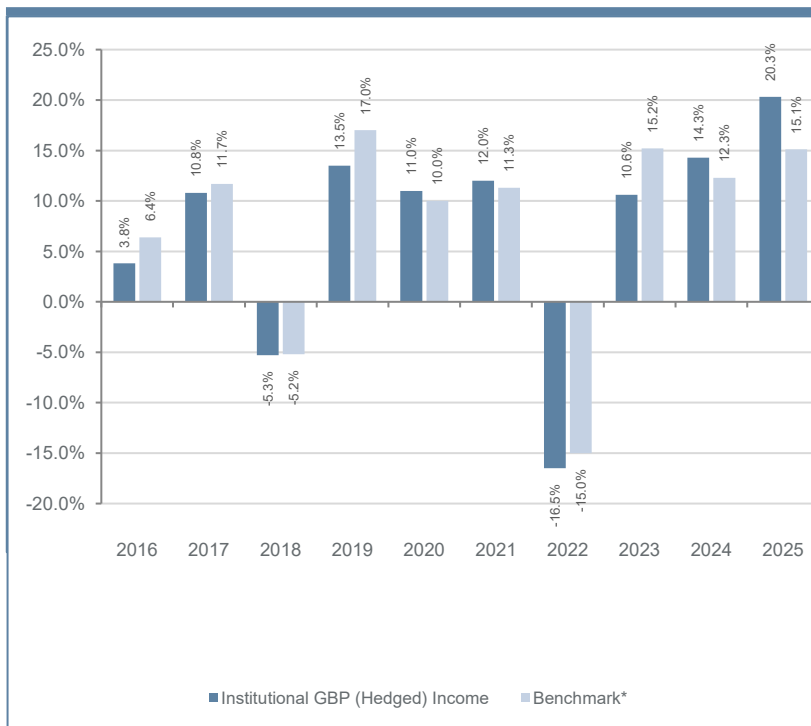
The charges you pay are used to pay for the costs of running the fund, which include the marketing and distributing costs. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.
