Objectives and Investment Policy

Objective: income and capital growth. The Fund aims to outperform the annual rate of the UK Consumer Price Index (CPI) by 5%, net of charges, over rolling ten year periods.

Although the Fund aims to achieve a positive return over rolling ten year periods, capital invested is, in fact, at risk and there is no guarantee that a positive return will be generated over that time period or any other time period.

Policy: the Fund will gain global exposure by investing in a diversified portfolio of assets which will include company shares (i.e. equities), bonds and similar debt investments, money-market instruments, cash and cash equivalents.

The Fund may invest directly in such assets or indirectly by investing in collective investment schemes, which may include those managed or operated by Quilter Investors, and derivatives.

The Fund may also indirectly invest in property and/or commodities (e.g. metals, agriculture, energy).

The Fund uses derivatives (i.e. financial contracts whose value is linked to the expected price movements of an underlying investment) with the aim of generating returns, reducing the overall costs and/or risks of the Fund, and to implement a long/short investment strategy.

The Fund may hold a long position (benefit from buying an asset with the aim of selling it later at a higher price to secure a profit) in an investment it favours, and short (benefit from the sale of an asset with the aim of buying it later at a lower price to secure a profit) an investment it does not favour. This may include exposure to currencies, property and/or commodities to the extent permitted by the FCA rules. This may result in the Fund being leveraged which magnifies the exposure of the Fund to greater than the underlying investments. In such situations, returns may rise or fall more than they would have done otherwise, reflecting such additional exposure. Overall the Fund will have a long position.

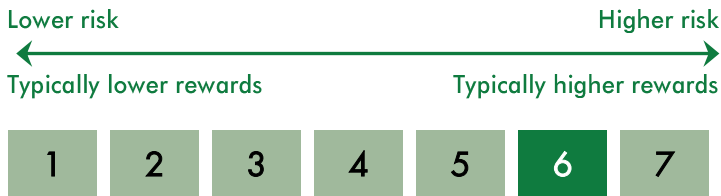
Target Benchmark: the target benchmark for the Fund is the annual rate of the UK Consumer Price Index (CPI) + 5%. The Fund is actively managed. The Fund investments are not constrained by the target benchmark.

Recommendation: the Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within 5 years.

Treatment of income: as shares in this class are accumulation shares, income from investments will be reinvested into the Fund and reflected in the value of the shares.

Dealing: you can buy and sell shares on any working day in London.

Risk and Reward Profile



The calculated risk and reward category, as shown above, uses a method of calculation derived from EU rules. It is based on the rate at which the returns of the Fund have moved up and down in the past (i.e. volatility) and is not a guide to the future risk and reward category of the Fund. The category shown is not a target or guarantee and may shift over time. Even the lowest category 1 does not mean a risk-free investment. The seven-category scale is nonlinear, for example, 2 is not twice as risky as 1.

Funds in category 6 have in the past shown relatively high volatility. With a fund of category 6, you have a relatively high risk of losing money but your chance for gains is also relatively high.

Investment risk - the performance aim is not a guarantee, may not be achieved and a capital loss may occur. Funds which have a higher performance aim generally take more risk to achieve this and so have a greater potential for the returns to be significantly different than expected.

Strategy risk - as the Fund invests in other collective investment schemes, which themselves invest in assets such as bonds, company shares, cash and currencies, it will be subject to the collective risks of these other funds. This may include emerging markets risk and sub-investment grade credit risk.

Emerging markets risk - less developed countries may face more political, economic or structural challenges than developed countries.

Credit risk - the issuer of a bond or a similar investment within the Fund may not pay income or repay capital to the Fund when due. Bonds which are rated below investment grade are considered to have a higher risk exposure with respect to meeting their payment obligations.

Interest rate risk - investments in bonds are affected by interest rates and inflation trends which may affect the value of the Fund.

Liquidity risk - some investments may become hard to value or sell at a desired time and price. In extreme circumstances this may affect the Fund's ability to meet redemption requests upon demand.

Currency risk - the Fund is denominated in British Pounds but may hold assets denominated in, or with exposure to, other currencies. The value of your shares may rise and fall as a result of exchange rate movements between these currencies.

Derivative risk - the Fund uses derivatives to generate returns and/or to reduce costs and the overall risk of the Fund. Using derivatives can involve a higher level of risk. A small movement in the price of an underlying investment may result in a disproportionately large movement in the price of the derivative investment. Derivatives also involve counterparty risk where the institutions acting as counterparty to derivatives may not meet their contractual obligations.

Capital erosion risk - the Fund takes its charges from the income of the Fund in the first instance. The impact of Fund charges may be material on the value of any income you receive from your investment. There is potential for capital erosion if insufficient income is generated by the Fund to cover these charges. Capital erosion may have the effect of reducing the level of income generated.

Charges

These charges are used to pay the costs of running the Fund, including the costs of marketing and distribution. Overall, they reduce the growth of your investment.

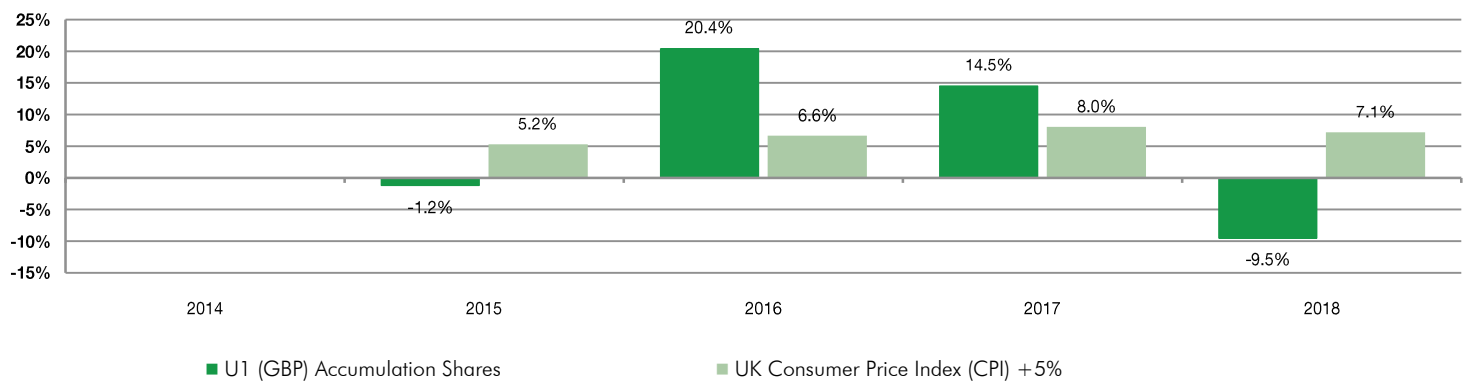
