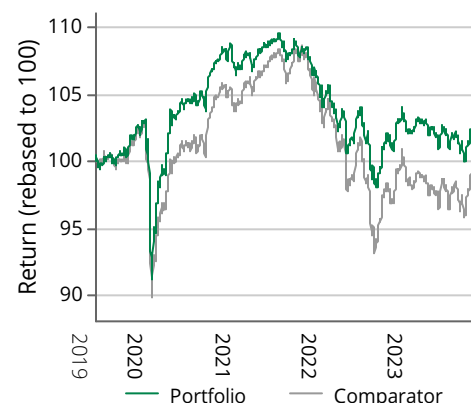
### Portfolio objective

To achieve capital growth over a period of five years or more through investment markets both in the UK and overseas. The portfolio will be broadly diversified across asset classes, with exposure to equities between 0-35% and with volatility of between 3 and 7%.\*The volatility range is a target, based on long term actuarial assumptions and the fund is managed to stay within this range most of the time. The volatility range is regularly reviewed and may change from time to time due to changes in these assumptions.

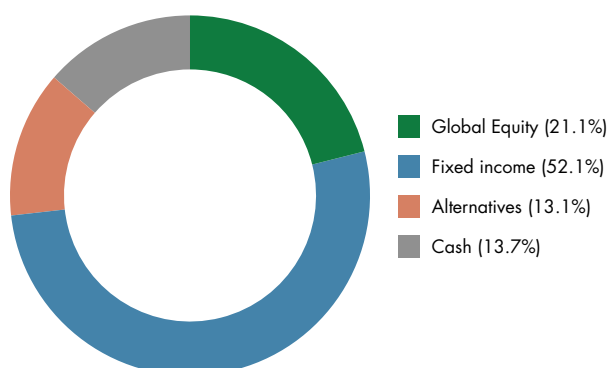

## Risk factors
