Objective

The Fund aims to provide a positive absolute return over the medium to long term (3 to 5 years or more) irrespective of market conditions, while reducing the risk of losses.

The Fund aims to exceed the return on cash deposits by 5% per annum, evaluated over rolling three year periods (before charges).


ESTR has been chosen as a current proxy for the return on cash deposits.

Key risks

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

Derivative usage

Derivatives can be used to generate growth, consistent with the Fund's risk profile, if market prices are expected to rise ('long positions') or fall ('short positions'). Leverage in the fund arises as a result of the use of derivatives. Examples of investment strategies implemented through derivatives are:
- An assessment of the expected level of a given stock market index;
- An assessment of one currency relative to another;
- An assessment of the direction of interest rates.
