Objective

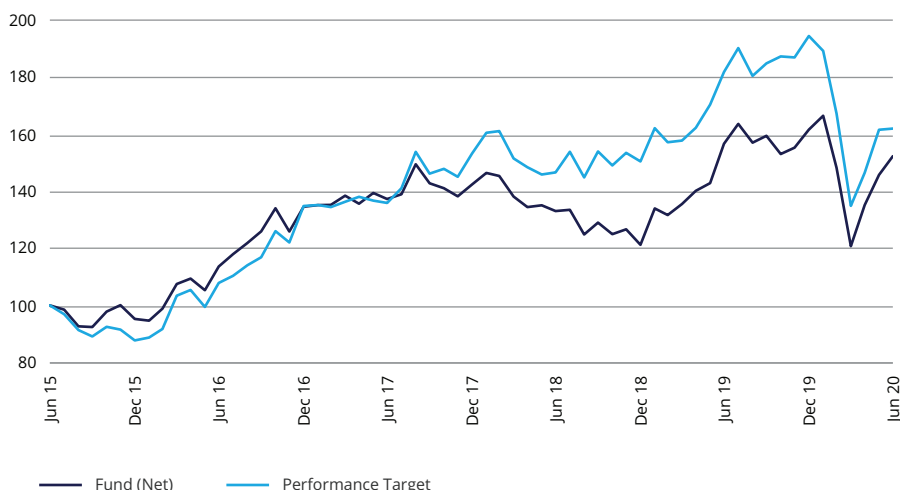
To generate growth over the long term (5 years or more) by investing in European emerging markets equities (company shares).

Performance Target: To achieve the return of the MSCI Emerging Market Europe 10/40 Index plus 3% per annum over three years (before charges). The Performance Target is the level of performance that the management team hopes to achieve for the fund. There is however no certainty or promise that they will achieve the Performance Target. The ACD believes this is an appropriate target for the fund based on the investment policy of the fund and the constituents of the index.

Portfolio securities

- The fund invests at least 70% in equities and equity related securities of companies listed, incorporated or domiciled in European emerging market countries, or companies that derive a significant proportion of their revenues or profits or have a significant proportion of their assets there.
- The fund may also invest up to 10% in other European equities.
- The fund may also invest in other funds (including those managed by Aberdeen Standard Investments), money-market instruments and cash.

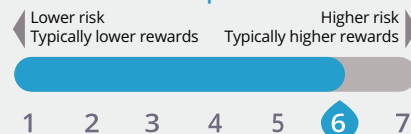

Key risks

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Management process

- The management team use their discretion (active management) to maintain a diverse asset mix at country, sector and stock level.
- Their primary focus is on stock selection using research techniques to select individual holdings. The research process is focused on finding high quality companies at attractive valuations that can be held for the long term.
- In seeking to achieve the Performance Target, the MSCI Emerging Market Europe 10/40 Index is used as a reference point for portfolio construction and as a basis for setting risk constraints. The expected variation (tracking error) between the returns of the fund and the index, is not ordinarily expected to exceed 12.5%. Due to the active nature of the management process, the Funds performance profile may deviate significantly from that of the MSCI Emerging Market Europe 10/40 Index over the long term.
