## Fund objective and policy

The Fund seeks to provide growth, combining capital and income, over the long term (at least 5 years) consistent with a cautious risk profile over the same time period. The Fund aims to achieve its objective by gaining exposure to a range of global asset classes whose products and services make a positive and material impact on the environment and/or society. Through this the Manager seeks to invest in companies that support a sustainable future; to avoid investments in companies with unsustainable business practices; and to improve investee companies' ESG practices through constructive engagement and voting. Typically, the Fund will maintain exposure to equities of between 20% - 60%. The Fund is actively managed and not managed with reference to a benchmark. It is not constrained by any particular asset allocation regarding geography, industry, or sector.

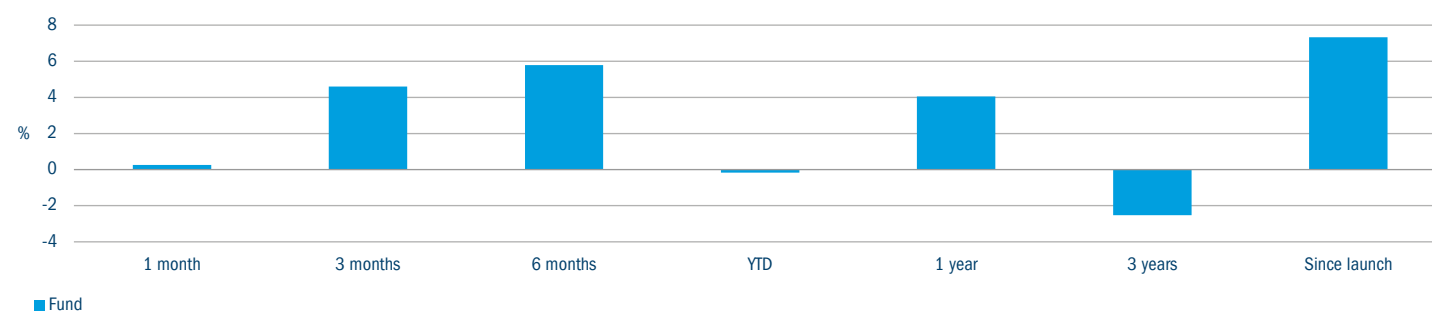
