Objective


To generate income and some growth over the long term (5 years or more) by investing in Sterling denominated investment grade corporate bonds.

Performance Target: To achieve the return of the iBoxx Sterling Collateralized & Corporates Index plus 1% per annum (before charges). The Performance Target is the level of performance that the management team hopes to achieve for the fund. There is however no certainty or promise that they will achieve the Performance Target. The ACD believes this is an appropriate target for the fund based on the investment policy of the fund and the constituents of the index.

Portfolio securities

- The fund will invest at least 60% in Sterling denominated investment grade corporate bonds.
- The fund may also invest in bonds issued anywhere in the world by governments and corporations, such as sub-sovereigns, sub-investment grade, inflation-linked, convertible, asset backed and mortgage-backed bonds. The fund will employ techniques to reduce (hedge) risk related to currency movements on non-Sterling bonds.
- The fund may also invest in other funds (including those managed by Aberdeen Standard Investments), money-market instruments, and cash.

The expected variation ('tracking error') between the returns of the fund and the index is not ordinarily expected to exceed 3.5%. Due the Funds risk constraints, the intention is that the Funds performance profile will not deviate significantly from the iBoxx Sterling Collateralized & Corporates Index over the longer term.
- Please Note: The Funds ability to buy and sell bonds and the associated costs can be affected during periods of market stress which could include periods where interest rates move sharply.
