To generate growth and income over the long term (5 years or more) by investing in infrastructure related equities (company shares).





Key risks

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Management process

The research process is focused on finding attractive high quality companies that can be held for the long term through the assessment of their business, the industry they operate in, their financial strength and the capability of their management team.
- Due to the active nature of the management process, the fund's performance profile may deviate significantly from that of the Index.
