Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide capital growth and income by investing in a portfolio of emerging market bonds (denominated in local currencies).




Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed.In normal market conditions, the Fund will primarily invest its assets in investment grade bonds and non-investment grade bonds issued by governments, government-related entities, supranational entities and companies that are based in emerging markets, as well as currency forwards and non-deliverable forwards. The Fund may invest up to 10% in onshore Chinese bonds which are issued within the People's Republic of China and traded on the China Interbank Bond Market. The Fund may invest up to 10% in convertible bonds, up to 10% in other funds and up to 10% in total return swaps. The Fund's primary currency exposure is to US dollars and currencies of other OECD (Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development) countries. Main risks


