What is this product?

Type

Ordinary shares in Riverstone Credit Opportunities Income Plc, a closed-ended investment company incorporated in England and Wales (the "Company"). The ordinary shares are traded in US Dollar on the Specialist Fund Segment of the London Stock Exchange. The Company has an unlimited life and there is no maturity date for the ordinary shares. There is no recommended holding period for the ordinary shares (although a holding period of 5 years has been used for the purpose of the calculations in this document). The Company may, but is under no obligation to, repurchase ordinary shares and investors should expect that the primary means of disposing of ordinary shares will be by sales on the secondary market. The price at which an investor may dispose of ordinary shares will depend on the prevailing secondary market price, which may, or may not, reflect the prevailing net asset value per ordinary share. Typically, at any given time on any given day, the price at which an ordinary share can be bought will be higher than the price at which an ordinary share can be sold.

Objective

The Company will seek to generate consistent shareholder returns predominantly in the form of income distributions, principally by making senior secured loans to energy-related businesses. The Company will seek to achieve its investment objective through investing in a diversified portfolio of direct and indirect investments in loans, notes, bonds and other debt instruments, including convertible debt, issued by entities ("Borrowers") operating in the energy sector ("Loans"). The Company may also invest in warrants or other equity interests or instruments received in connection with (for example, stapled instruments), or as a consequence of (for example, due to a workout, refinancing or restructuring or mezzanine financing), an investment in Loans.

The Company may borrow to purchase investments, which may magnify any gains or losses made by the Company.

The Company is not specifically intended for retail investors.
