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
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What is this Product?

Ordinary Shares in abrdn China Investment Company Limited, an actively managed investment company, registered in Guernsey and listed on the London Stock Exchange. Its investment objective is to produce long-term capital growth by investing predominantly in Chinese equities. The Company invests in companies listed, incorporated or domiciled in the People's Republic of China ("China"), or companies that derive a significant proportion of their revenues or profits from China operations or have a significant proportion of their assets there. In furtherance of this New Investment Policy, the portfolio will normally consist principally of quoted equity securities and depositary receipts although unlisted companies, fixed interest holdings or other non-equity investments may be held. Investments in unquoted companies will be made where Aberdeen Standard Fund Managers Limited has a reasonable expectation that the company will seek a listing in the near future. The Company will be actively managed and may invest in companies of any size and in any sector. The Company may borrow to purchase assets. The Company does not have a fixed life but shareholders have the opportunity to vote for continuation every five years. Further, in certain other circumstances the Company may be wound up following a proposal from the directors and its approval by the shareholders, subject to compliance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements. Aberdeen Standard Fund Managers Limited may not unilaterally terminate the Company. Shares in the Company are bought and sold on a stock market. Investment in the Company is only suitable for investors who are comfortable with the risks and investment time horizon set out in this document and may not be appropriate if you plan to sell some or all of your shares within 5 years. The Company is expected to have an ESG rating equal to, or better than, the MSCI China All Shares Index and have meaningfully lower carbon intensity than the Index.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because the Company is not able to pay you.



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for at least 5 years. The actual risk can vary significantly. The value of investments and the income from them can go down as well as up, and you may get back less than you invested.

We have classified this product as 5, which is a medium high risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium high level, and poor market conditions could impact the amount you could get back.

If the product is not held for the recommended holding period, the potential risk may be significantly higher than the one shown above. This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment. The Company borrows in order to purchase assets, and this may magnify gains or losses. Shares in the Company may trade at a discount to their Net Asset Value, which may adversely affect the value of your investment, particularly when you come to sell your shares. The stress scenario on page 2 shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances, and it does not take into account the situation where we are not able to pay you. This table shows the money you could get back over the next 5 years, under different scenarios, assuming that you invest £10,000. The scenarios shown illustrate how your investment could perform. You can compare them with the scenarios of other products. The scenarios presented are an estimate of future performance based on evidence from the past, and are not an exact indicator. What you get will depend on how the market performs and how long you keep the investment.

What happens if the Company is unable to pay out?

As a shareholder in the Company, you would not be able to make a claim to the Financial Services Compensation Scheme about the Company in the event that the Company is unable to pay dividends to you or if it were unable to pay any amounts due to you on the winding up of the Company.

What are the costs?

The Reduction in Yield (RIY) shows what impact the total costs you pay will have on the investment return you might get. The total costs take into account one-off, ongoing and incidental costs.

The amounts shown here are the cumulative costs of the product itself, for three different holding periods. They include potential early exit penalties. The figures assume you invest £10,000. The figures are estimates and may change in the future.

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

This product has no required minimum holding period but is designed for medium to long-term investment. Since the value of investments and the income from them can rise and fall over differing time periods, you should have an investment horizon of at least 5 years when buying an investment of this type.

The minimum recommended holding period is therefore 5 years.

As the shares are listed on the London Stock Exchange, you may buy or sell shares on any normal business day that the London Stock Exchange is open for business.
