**What is this Product?**

Ordinary Shares in Aberdeen Standard European Logistics Income PLC, an actively managed investment company registered in England and listed on the London Stock Exchange. Its investment objective is to provide a regular and attractive level of income return together with the potential for long term income and capital growth from investing in high quality European logistics real estate. Currency hedging is employed to mitigate the potential volatility of income returns from the portfolio in Sterling terms and to provide greater certainty as to the level of Sterling distributions expected to be paid. The Company may borrow to purchase assets. The Company does not have a fixed life but shareholders have the opportunity to vote on the continuation of the Company in 2024 and then every 5 years thereafter. Shares in the Company are bought and sold on a stock market. Investment in the Company is only suitable for investors who are comfortable with the risks and investment time horizon set out in this document and may not be appropriate if you plan to sell some or all of your shares within 5 years.

**What are the risks and what could I get in return?**

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because the Company is not able to pay you.

The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for at least 5 years. The actual risk can vary significantly. The value of investments and the income from them can go down as well as up, and you may get back less than you invested.

## What happens if the Company is unable to pay out?

## What are the costs?

## How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

This product has no required minimum holding period but is designed for medium to long-term investment. Since the value of investments and the income from them can rise and fall over differing time periods, you should have an investment horizon of at least 5 years when buying an investment of this type. The minimum recommended holding period is therefore 5 years. As the shares are listed on the London Stock Exchange, you may buy or sell shares on any normal business day that the London Stock Exchange is open for business.
