Objective and investment policy

The fund aims to provide a combination of capital growth and income, net of the ongoing charges figure, that is higher than that of the EMIX Smaller European Companies Index over any five-year period.

Core investment: At least 80% of the fund is invested in the shares of European smaller companies, from the bottom third (by total market capitalisation) of all publicly listed stocks in Europe including the UK. The fund is concentrated and usually holds shares in fewer than 45 companies.

Sustainability considerations are fully integrated into the investment process. Companies that are assessed to be in breach of the United Nations Global Compact principles on human rights, labour, environment and anti-corruption are excluded from the investment universe. Industries such as tobacco and controversial weapons are also excluded.

Other investments: The fund may invest in other funds (including funds managed by M&G) and cash or assets that can be turned into cash quickly.

Derivatives: The fund may use derivatives to reduce the risks and costs of managing the fund.

Strategy in brief: The fund manager invests in the shares of smaller companies with sustainable business models, where short-term issues have created buying opportunities due to these companies being, in the fund manager's view, undervalued. The fund manager believes that this approach offers a powerful combination of the long-term, compounding growth that quality businesses can deliver, along with the potential boost to a company's share price when a short-term issue has been resolved.

Benchmark: EMIX Smaller European Companies Index

The benchmark is a target which the fund seeks to outperform. The index has been chosen as the fund's benchmark as it best reflects the scope of the fund's investment policy. The benchmark is used solely to measure the fund's performance and does not constrain the fund's portfolio construction.

The fund is actively managed. The fund manager has complete freedom in choosing which investments to buy, hold and sell in the fund. The fund's holdings may deviate significantly from the benchmark's constituents.

For unhedged and hedged share Classes, the benchmark is shown in the share class currency.

Other information

You can buy and sell shares in the fund on any business day. Instructions received before 12 noon will be dealt at that day's price.

Any income from the fund may be paid out to you annually.

In addition to the charges set out in the charges section, the fund will incur portfolio transaction costs which are paid from the assets of the fund. These can be higher when investing outside Europe.

Recommendation: This fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within 5 years.

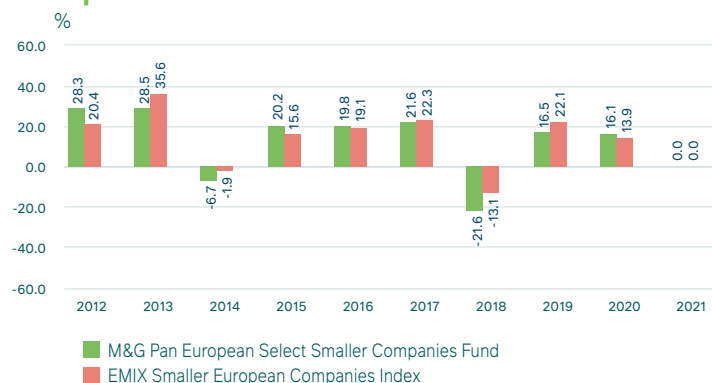
