Objectives and investment policy

Objectives <p>The fund aims to provide capital growth in excess of the MSCI Arabian Markets and Turkey (Net TR) index with Saudi Arabia capped at 20% after fees have been deducted over a three to five year period by investing in equities of Middle Eastern companies. The fund also invests in companies in emerging Mediterranean markets and North Africa.</p> Investment policy <p>The fund is actively managed and invests at least two-thirds of its assets in equities of companies in the Middle Eastern companies including companies in emerging Mediterranean markets and North Africa. The fund typically holds 30-70 companies.</p> <p>The fund may also invest up to one-third of its assets directly or indirectly in other securities (including other asset classes), countries, regions, industries or currencies, investment funds, warrants and money market investments, and hold cash (subject to the restrictions provided in the prospectus).</p> <p>The fund may use derivatives with the aim of achieving investment gains, reducing risk or managing the fund more efficiently.</p>	Benchmark <p>The fund's performance should be assessed against its target benchmark being to exceed the MSCI Arabian Markets and Turkey (Net TR) index with Saudi Arabia capped at 20%. The fund's investment universe is expected to overlap materially, directly or indirectly, with the components of the target benchmark. The investment manager invests on a discretionary basis and there are no restrictions on the extent to which the fund's portfolio and performance may deviate from the target benchmark. The investment manager will invest in companies or sectors not included in the target benchmark in order to take advantage of specific investment opportunities.</p> <p>The target benchmark has been selected because it is representative of the type of investments in which the fund is likely to invest and it is, therefore, an appropriate target in relation to the return that the fund aims to provide.</p> Dealing frequency <p>You may redeem your investment upon demand. This fund deals daily.</p> Distribution policy <p>This share class accumulates income received from the fund's investments, meaning it is kept in the fund and its value is reflected in the price of the share class.</p>

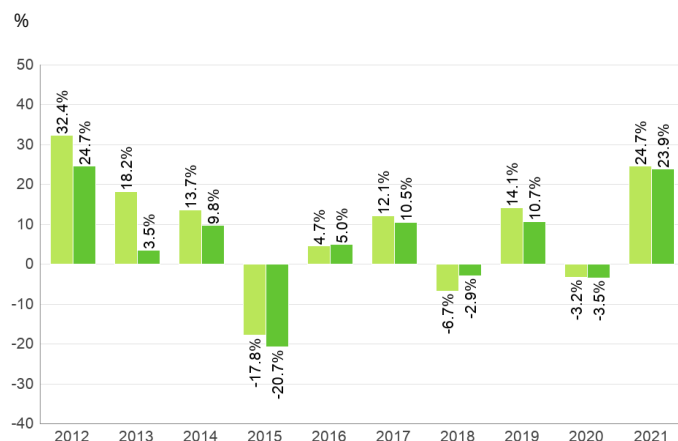
The charges you pay are used to pay the costs of running the fund, including the costs of marketing and distributing it. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.
