Objective and investment policy

The fund aims to provide:

- an annual yield higher than that of the FTSE All-Share Index;
- an income stream that increases every year; and
- a higher total return (the combination of capital growth and income), net of the Ongoing Charge Figure, than a composite index over any five-year period.

The composite index is 70% FTSE All-Share Index and 30% FTSE Actuaries UK Conventional Gilts All Stocks Index.

Core investment: At least 70% of the fund is invested directly in the shares of companies across any sector and of any size that are based, listed or do most of their business, in the UK.

Other investments: The fund may also invest in sterling-denominated investment grade bonds and in the shares of non-UK companies, other funds (including funds managed by M&G), cash or assets that can be turned into cash quickly.

Derivatives: The fund may use derivatives with the aim of reducing the risks and costs of managing the fund.

Strategy in brief: The fund manager selects stocks using a bottom-up approach across a range of sectors. A long-term perspective is adopted when identifying companies that exhibit strong business operations, good cashflows and attractive dividend growth prospects. Although the fund's focus gives it a bias towards areas of the market that typically offer a high income, it aims to be broadly spread across a variety of businesses. Investment in bonds is usually for the purposes of reducing the volatility of the fund, whilst providing a stable source of income.

Benchmarks:

- Yield: FTSE All-Share Index
- Total return: 70% FTSE All-Share Index and 30% FTSE Actuaries UK Conventional Gilts All Stocks Index

The benchmarks are targets which the fund seeks to outperform, and have been chosen as they best reflect the scope of the fund's investment policy. The benchmarks are used solely to measure the fund's performance and do not constrain the fund's portfolio construction.

The fund is actively managed. The fund manager has complete freedom in choosing which investments to buy, hold and sell in the fund. The fund's holdings may deviate significantly from the constituents of the benchmarks.

The total return benchmark is shown in the share class currency.

Other information

You can buy and sell shares in the fund on any business day. Instructions received before 12 noon will be dealt at that day's price.

Any income from the fund may be paid out to you quarterly.

In addition to the charges set out in the charges section, the fund will incur portfolio transaction costs which are paid from the assets of the fund.

Recommendation: This fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within 5 years.

The charges shown in the table are used to pay the costs of running the fund, including the costs of marketing and distributing it. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.

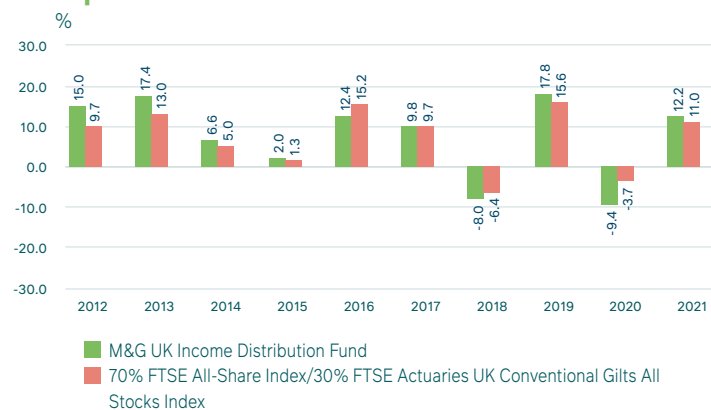
